Here's something you need to hear about before the end of this season. There is a new collection created for all who want to pray and might not have a lot of free time. Christopher Walker and Daughter of Charity Sister Paule Freeburg have collaborated on a prayer service project based on the Liturgy of the Hours, *Morning and Evening: Prayer for the Journey*. There is a 2-CD set (OCP 20099TL) so you can listen in the car on the way to and from work. There is also a prayerbook (OCP 20139TL). This collection is invaluable for nursing homes, small groups, retreats, hospital rooms and the homebound. Buy a set and simply have it on hand for anyone who's looking for prayer resources. You might even get home in time for supper sometimes.

 ${\it Musicianship\ Basics}$ (Continued from the Thirtieth Week in Ordinary Time.)

Here's a little transposition trick that might be especially helpful for organists, pianists, and other instrumentalists. The combination number for this trick is seven. For example, if E major has four sharps, then Eb major will have 3 flats (7-4=3). Again, if Bb major has two flats, then B major will have 5 sharps (7-2=5). How is this helpful? Imagine this: a piece is written in Eb major (with 3bs). For the last verse, substitute the key signature of E major (with 4#s) and proceed with the same notes, just a different key signature. Beware of accidentals! (Continued next week.)

The Thanksgiving Day Mass prayers are found after November 30 in the "Proper of Saints" section in the Sacramentary. The Lectionary (684A) notes that today's readings may be chosen from the "In Thanksgiving" section of "Masses for Various Needs and Occasions" (943-947). There is a preface for Thanksgiving Day (P84), although preface IV for weekdays in Ordinary Time is also a good choice today (P40—"our desire to thank you is itself your gift"). Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions IV echoes the concern for others that appears in today's opening prayer, prayer over the gifts and prayer after Communion. The *Book of Blessings* (Liturgical Press, 800-858-5450, litpress.org) offers an

appropriate greeting (1764) and a sample prayer of the faithful (1760). Invite people to bring food for the poor to Mass today, and use the first form of the "Order for the Blessing of Food for Thanksgiving Day" in the *Book of Blessings* (ch. 58). The second form of this prayer situates the blessing within a celebration of the word and may be led by a deacon or lay minister. The food may not be able to reach the needy in time for Thanksgiving dinner, but it will visibly connect this holiday liturgy to the service of the poor and can help replenish the shelves of a local food distribution program after Thanksgiving.
